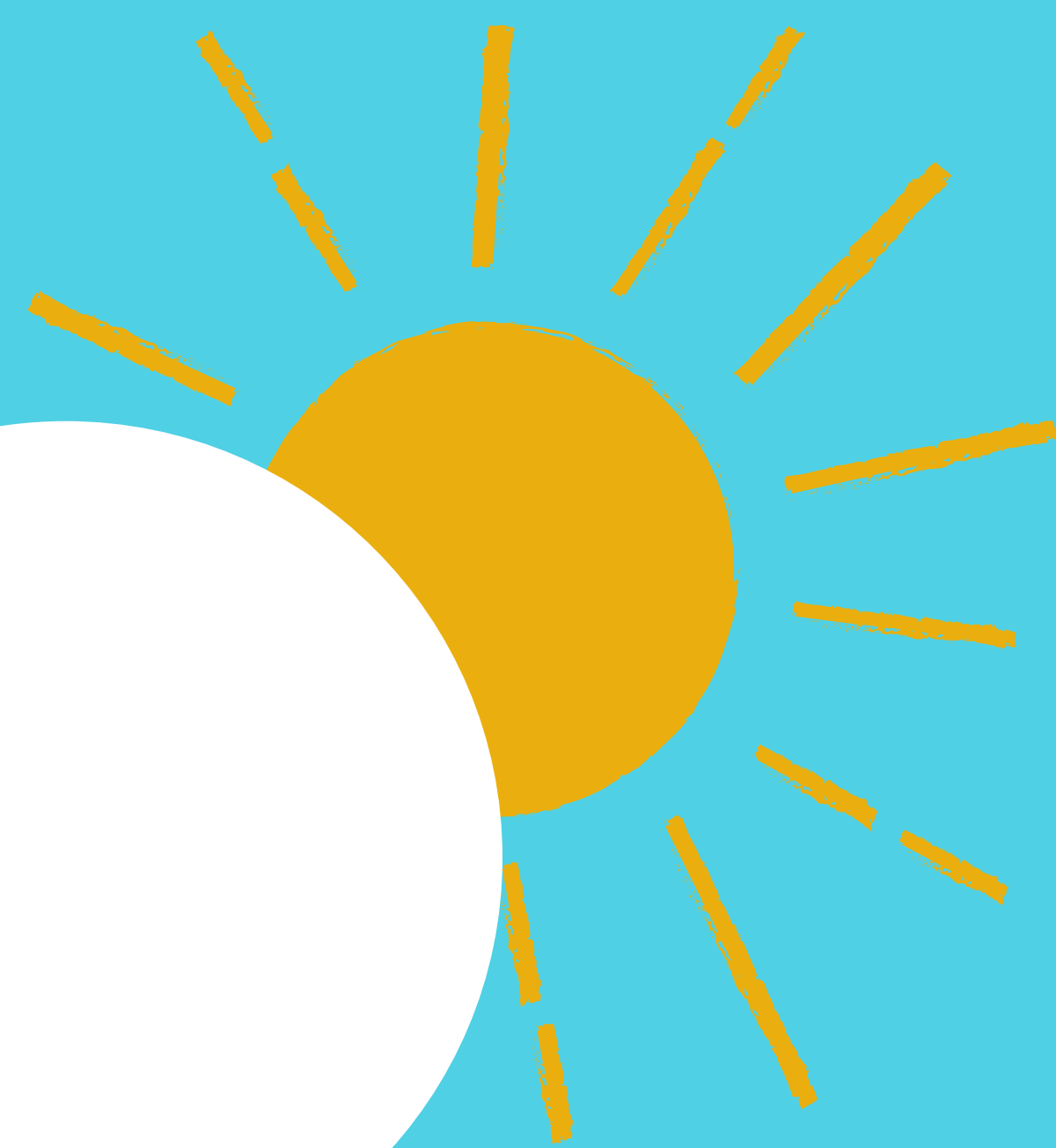

SLIDE on sunglasses

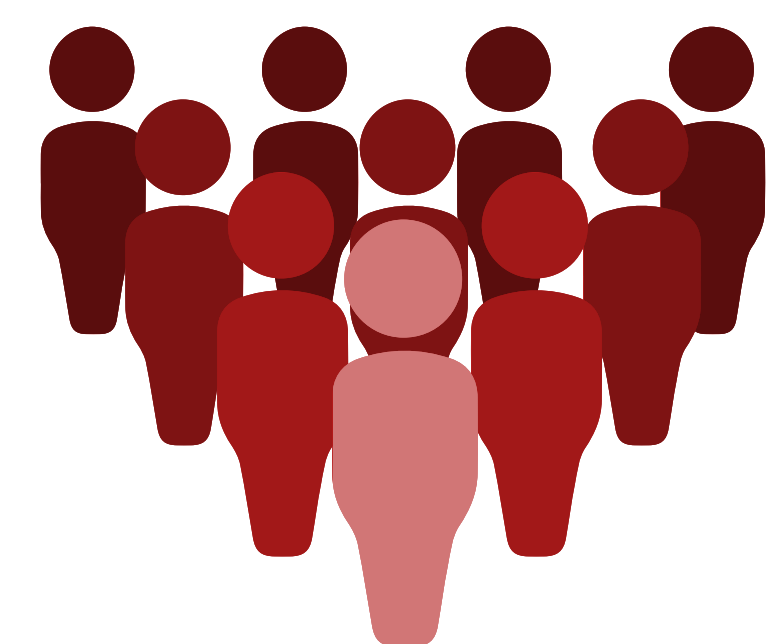
SLAP on a hat

Apply 1oz. of sunscreen every 2 hours, or immediately after swimming or sweating.

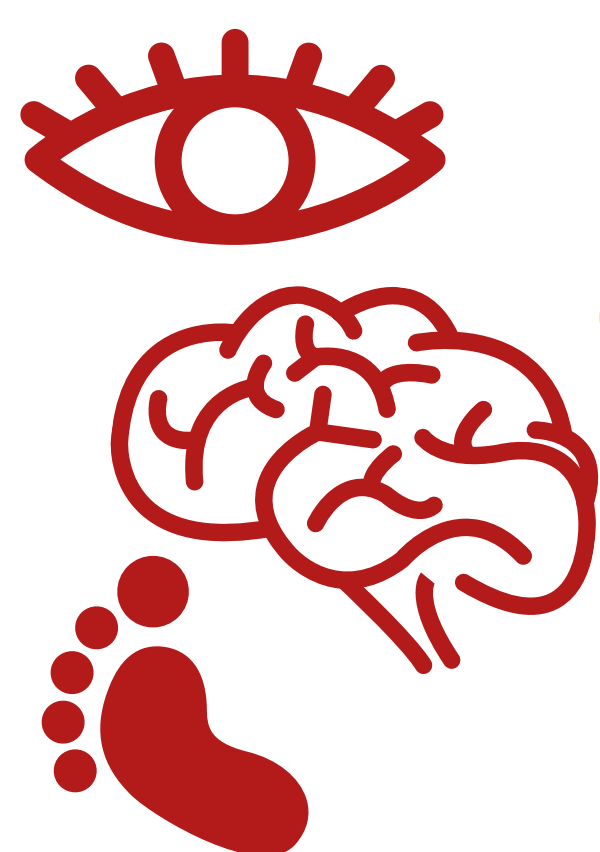
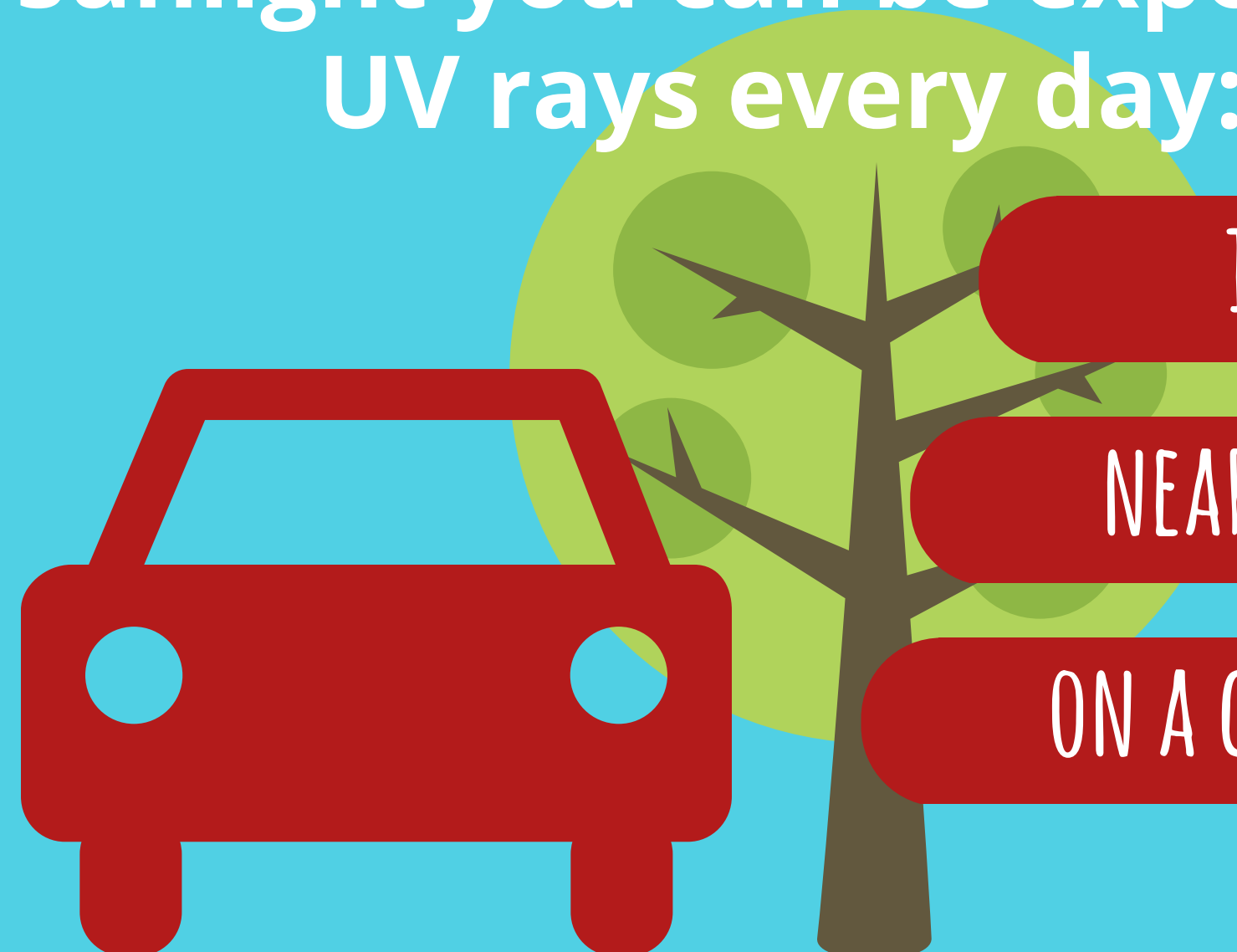


Even if you're not in direct sunlight you can be exposed to UV rays every day:
